

ADVERBS (TYPES OF ADVERBS)

- An **adverb** is a word that describes a **verb**, an action.
- It tells us something about **the way something is done**.
- Many adverbs end with an **-ly**.

<p>ADVERBS of MANNER</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describes HOW something is done. • Mostly placed at the end of a sentence. • NOTE! FAST (adj.) - FAST (adv.) HARD (adj.) - HARD (adv.) GOOD (adj.) - WELL (adv.) • Quietly, carefully, noisily, closely, easily, beautifully, badly, angrily, mysteriously painfully, kindly, smoothly, silently 	 <p><i>He drives safely.</i></p>  <p><i>She walked slowly.</i></p>										
<p>ADVERBS of TIME</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describes WHEN something happens. • Can be placed both at the beginning or the end of a sentence. • Later, just, tonight, today, soon, yet, next week, this year, still, already, eventually, late, early, at the moment 	 <p><i>Tomorrow we go to London.</i></p>  <p><i>I eat now.</i></p>										
<p>ADVERBS of PLACE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describes WHERE something happens. • Can be placed both at the beginning or the end of a sentence. • On, off, over, under, outside, above, below, between, in the middle of, indoors, abroad, indoors, anywhere 	 <p><i>They are inside.</i></p>  <p><i>He walks downstairs.</i></p>
